George Saunders is the author of nine books. including Lincoln in the Bardo winner of the 2017 Man Booker Prize Tenth of December was a finalist for the National Book Award and won the inaugural Folio Prize. He has received MacArthur and Guggenheim fellowships and the PEN/Malamud Prize for excellence in the short story, and is an elected member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, In 2013, he was named one of the world's 100 most influential people by *Time* magazine. George Saunders teaches in the creative writing programme at Syracuse University.
